Blaufränkisch

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Blaufränkisch is a grape that has been cultivated since the 18th century and is native to central Europe. Blaufränkisch is the flagship red grape of Austria and of Weingut Judith Beck. The wine is well structured, full of character and has a good aging potential. Handpicked, natural fermentation in wooden vat, 12 days of maceration, then pressed and aged in large wooden barrels for 12 months.

Judith is an iconoclast. She is one of the world's most well respected women in wine and biodynamic vigneron. She farms 15 hectares in the warm flatlands of Burgenland, Austria with a focus on the region's indigenous varieties. Judith Beck is living and working among the vines in Gols, Austria on her family estate that her parents started in 1976.
